Continent	A large area of land divided into countries
Country	An area defined by its people, culture, language, geography and government

Weather	The specific atmospheric conditions on a given day including temperature and rainfall.
Population	The number of people living in an area
Physical geography	Anything that in an area that is naturally occurring

What I will know by the end of the unit:

I know that the population of Spain is 47.78 million people, which is made up of mainland Spain and Spanish Islands.

I know that Spain is in the continent of Europe, located in the South-Western part of the continent. It is surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean to the West, the Bay of Biscay to the North, the Mediterranean Sea to the South and the Balearic Sea to the East.

I know that the highest mountain on mainland Spain is Mulhacen (3482m) and the longest river is the River Ebro in Spain (970 km)
I know that Spain shares a border with France, Andorra and Portugal.

I know that there are many different landscapes, climates, physical and human characteristics within this area.

I know that the average warmest month in Spain and the UK is July and I know the average coldest month is January. I know how to read temperatures using a thermometer.

I know how land use differs across Europe and Spain. I know the main type of land use in the UK is agriculture and in Spain it is 50% agriculture and 50% Arable.
