

Drama Stage 8/9: Find Me

Key Words:

Script: The written text of a play or film.

Act: A way that a play is divided into sections, mainly between one to five acts per play.

Scene: A subdivision of an act, represents actions happening in one place at a time.

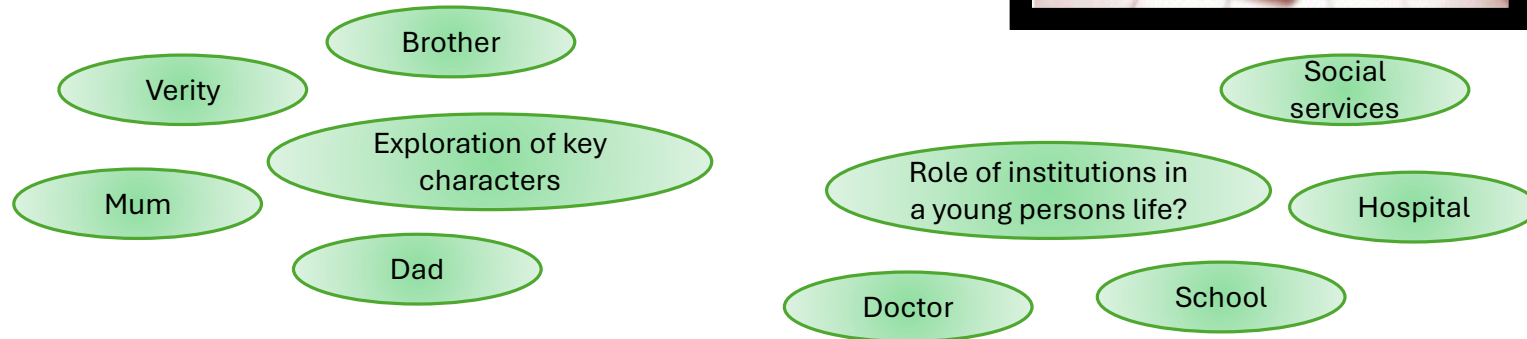
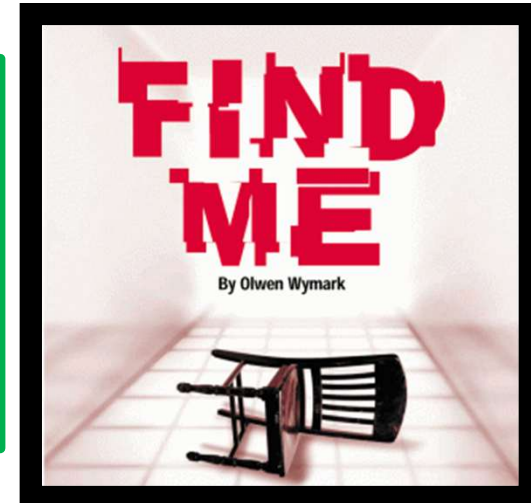
Context: The background of a play, including information of where the play is set and time of the play.

Characters: A person or individual in the play/drama.

Improvisation: The characters, plot and dialogue are made up in the moment.

Still image: A frozen picture that communicates a meaning.

Find Me is a play by Olwen Wymark about a girl called Verity Taylor who struggles with her mental health. From a young age, Verity shows signs that she's not coping, but people around her don't always understand. She is sent to different schools and hospitals, but doesn't get the help she really needs. Her behaviour sometimes scares others, but inside she is hurting. The play shows how important it is to listen, understand, and support people with mental health difficulties. The title *Find Me* is Verity's cry to be seen, heard, and truly understood.



You will explore the play text by discussing characters, setting and the situation of the characters involved. You will develop scenes from characters you create and perform elements of the script.
