Key Vocabulary

Justice	When there is a suitable consequence for an action.
Punishment	The act of receiving a penalty for committing a certain act.
Sin	Any act that falls short of the standard of God. Perfection.
Parable	A story with a specific meaning or teaching.
Propitiation	The sacrifice required to appease the wrath of God.
Vision	What a person sees for the future.
Society	The people and institutions that make up where we live.
Values	The attributes/acts you see as important.

What I will know by the end of the unit:

I can explain the word justice. I can give examples of justice in society. I can discuss my thoughts on how just different forms of punishment are. I can give examples of when punishments may not be just.

I know that Christians believe God is perfectly just. I can explain why people are upset when justice is not done. I can discuss how God would demonstrate justice to the sinful. I can explore why sinners being forgiven without punishment is a problem.
