<p>I know that the forest itself is the learning space that can be used as a <b>nature classroom</b> with <b>trees</b>, plants, water sources, and wildlife forming the resources.</p>
<p>I know that <b>unstructured play</b> is when I am given freedom to explore, play, and interact with the environment in ways I choose which is promoting curiosity and creativity.</p>
<p>I know that <b>seasonal learning</b> is when seasons offer different experiences. This can include observing changes in plants and animal behaviours throughout the year.</p>
<p>I know that <b>survival skills</b> are practical skills such as building shelters, making fires, and using <b>tools</b> safely.</p>
<p>I know that <b>problem-solving</b> can be used in many different activities, like building dens or completing tasks. I also know that <b>teamwork</b> requires working together which is encouraging collaboration and social skills.</p>
<p>I know that <b>risk management</b> is learning to assess risks in nature (e.g., climbing trees) this will support my independence and resilience.</p>
