<p>I know that a <b>tool talk</b> at forest school is a <b>safety</b> discussion that happens before using tools. It teaches me how to use tools correctly and responsibly while ensuring everyone stays safe.</p>
<p>I know that <b>teamwork</b> at forest school refers to the collaborative efforts of working together to achieve common goals, solve problems, or complete tasks in the outdoor environment. It emphasizes communication, cooperation, and sharing responsibility.</p>
<p>I know that <b>secateurs</b> are small, handheld cutting tools used for trimming or cutting small branches, twigs, and plants. They are similar to scissors but designed to handle tougher material like branches in gardening.</p>
<p>I know that <b>loppers</b> are a type of gardening tool used for cutting thick branches and stems. They look like large scissors with long handles, which give extra leverage for cutting through tougher materials. I know that it is important to keep a safe <b>distance</b> away from anyone else while using tools.</p>
<p>I know that a <b>knife</b> at forest school is a tool used (typically under supervision) to help with activities such as whittling, carving wood, or preparing kindling for a fire. It teaches valuable skills such as careful handling, respect for tools, and safety in outdoor environments</p>
<p>I know that a <b>bow saw</b> is a type of saw with a frame that is shaped like a bow, used for cutting wood and branches. It consists of a long, thin blade stretched between two arms (the frame) that can be used to cut through larger pieces of wood, such as logs or tree branches.</p>
