Volunteering	Community service, charity, helping others, social action, mentoring, environmental work.

I know that the DofE bronze award has four different elements, **volunteering**, **physical**, **skills** and the **expedition**. I know that I have to complete 3 months on 3 different elements and 6 months on 1 element.

I know that **leadership** on the DofE course refers to the skills and qualities demonstrated, especially during the Expedition section. The DofE program encourages me to develop leadership abilities by, leading Teams, decision making, supporting others and taking responsibility.

I know that the DofE requires **teamwork** and this foster in several key ways including collaborative planning, shared responsibilities, problem solving and through supporting each other.

I know the term **challenge** refers to personal goals and tasks that I must undertake to develop skills, resilience, and leadership qualities. The program is divided into several sections and each one presents its own challenges.

I know that in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE) **adventure** is most closely associated with the **expedition** section, which is one of the core parts of the program. The adventure aspect comes from the need to plan, undertake and complete an outdoor journey in a group, usually in a remote or unfamiliar environment. I know that I need to have **self-motivation** in order to fully engage myself in the course to ensure I complete all element to the best of my ability.
