Roy Lichtenstein used words to describe sounds in his Artwork 'Whamm!' painted in 1963.

Lichtenstein used mainly the primary colours in his artwork, along with Benday dots. Benday dots are named after their inventor and illustrator Benjamin Day. In 1879 Benjamin Day developed a low cost printing technique which made printing colour images easier and cost effective

Pop Art started after the rationing of WW2.

The government wanted people to spend more money to help grow the economy.
